

## Providing Waiver Services to Family Members:

1. A parent of a minor (under 18) cannot provide waiver services as an independent provider or work for an agency to provide services to their son or daughter.

From Provider Certification rule 5123: 2-2-01 F(1)(a)

2. A guardian or a person legally responsible (i.e. court appointed, custodial parent, etc) for a minor (under 18) cannot provide waiver services as an independent provider or work for an agency to provide services to their family member.

3. A related guardian can provide waiver services to the person they are responsible for (18 years and over), as either an independent provider or be employed by an agency to work with the individual for who they are legally responsible.

4. A family member (excluding the above) can provide waiver services to the family member (adult or minor) as an independent provider or be employed by an agency who provides waiver services to the individual.

5. Spouses are not permitted to furnish waiver services to their spouses.

6. Guardians who are unrelated to their dependents are not permitted to furnish waiver services to their dependents.

7. Adult Foster Care must be used when an individual chooses to receive personal care services and supports from an unrelated caregiver with whom he or she resides. Relatives/family members may not furnish adult foster care to their relatives/family members.

8. Adult Family Living must be used when a family member wishes to provide services to an individual (18 years and older) residing in the same home as the family member.

\*Prior Authorization may not be requested for Adult Family Living services. 5123: 2-9-32 E (10)
